

Grade 12 PSDians triumph in 2nd Ibtikar Competition
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PSDian Seniors, Louis Zendrix C. Adornado (12-Mercury) and Daniella Kite V. Latorre (12-Cadmium), under the supervision of Dr. Julie Ann B. Real, SHS Research Teacher, secured the 1st place and Gold Award, besting different schools in Qatar, during the 2nd Ibtikar Competition, organized by the Qatar Scientific Club in collaboration with the Ministry of Education and Higher Education on May 6 at the Qatar Scientific Club Headquarters.

After months of intense preparation since September 2023, the Grade 12 students were honored as the Ibtikar Competition Gold Awardees. With their project entitled "The Use of TensorFlow Action Recognition as the Main Component in Making a Sign Language Translator Speaker for Speech-impaired People," PSD stood out as the top scorer and leading school in different phases of the competition held starting from October 9 of last year.

During the awarding ceremony, Adornado and Latorre were initially puzzled as the announcement of winners was in Arabic. However, when they heard "first rank," followed by the name of their school, PSD, and their project title, the two realized their feat.

Reflecting on their success, Adornado shared his sense of attainment. He stated,

"I feel like I accomplished a goal in my high school life, leaving a mark in the history of this school. It made me feel complete and confident in my future endeavors."
