The Philippine School Doha held tryouts for its volleyball varsity teams, the Mighty Oryx and Lady Oryx, on September 1 and 2, followed by the basketball varsity, the PSD Falcons, on September 5 at the EVB Gymnasium — showcasing PSDian athletes' skills and determination.
