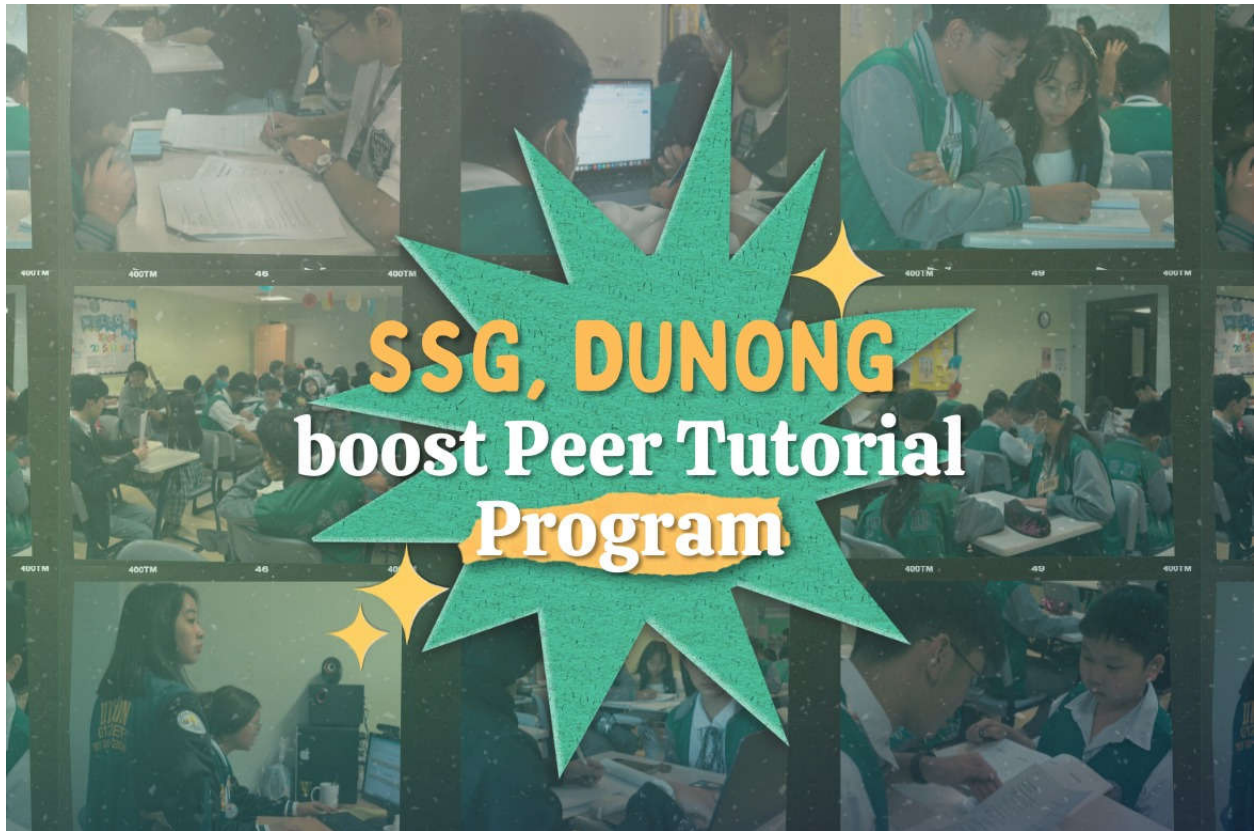


SSG, Dunong boost Peer Tutorial Program

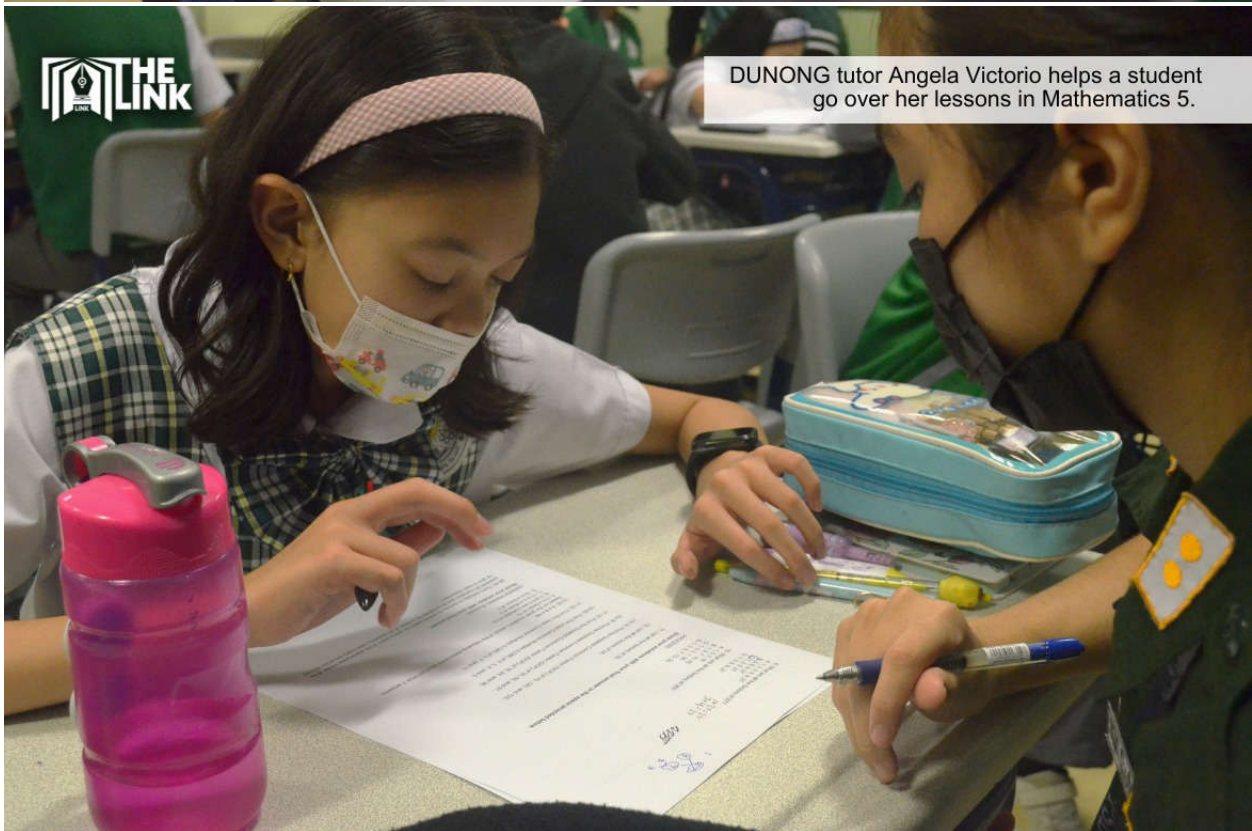


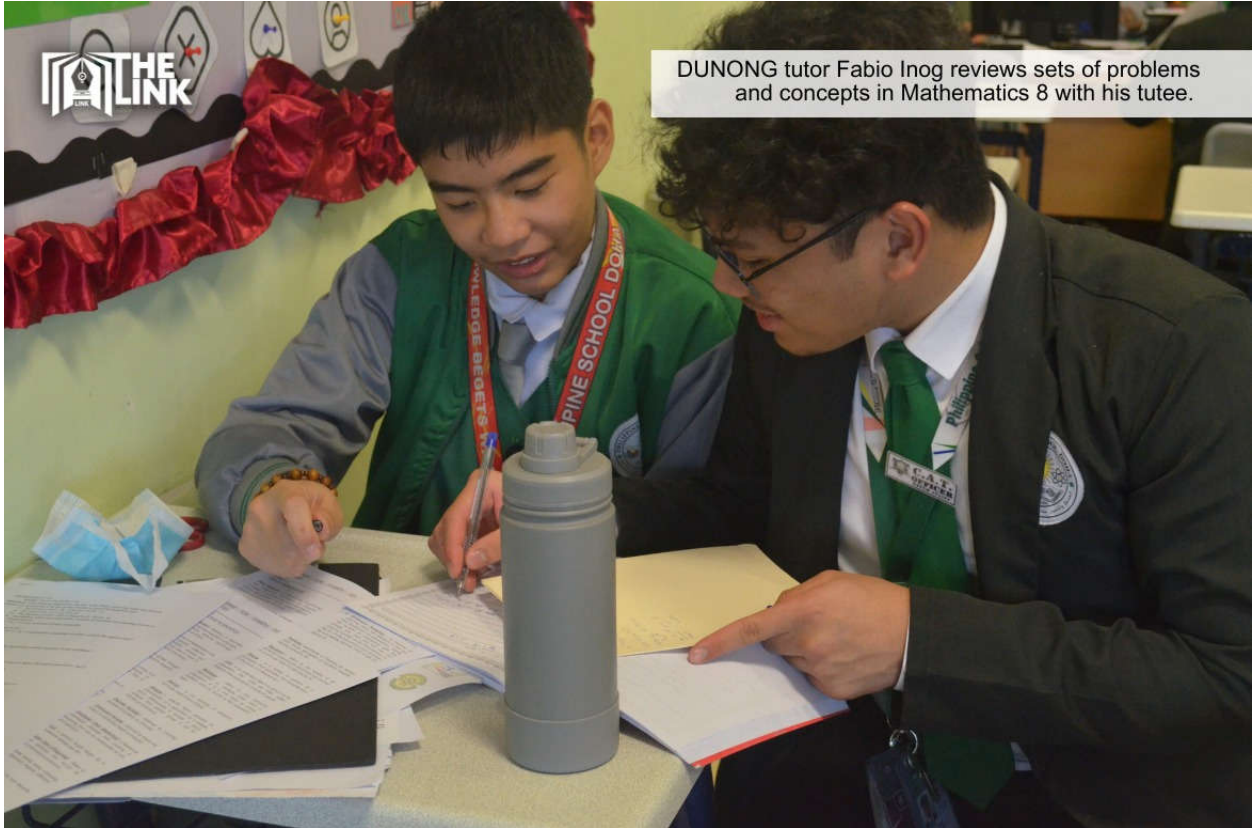


An Intermediate student works her way around a problem with the help of her tutor.

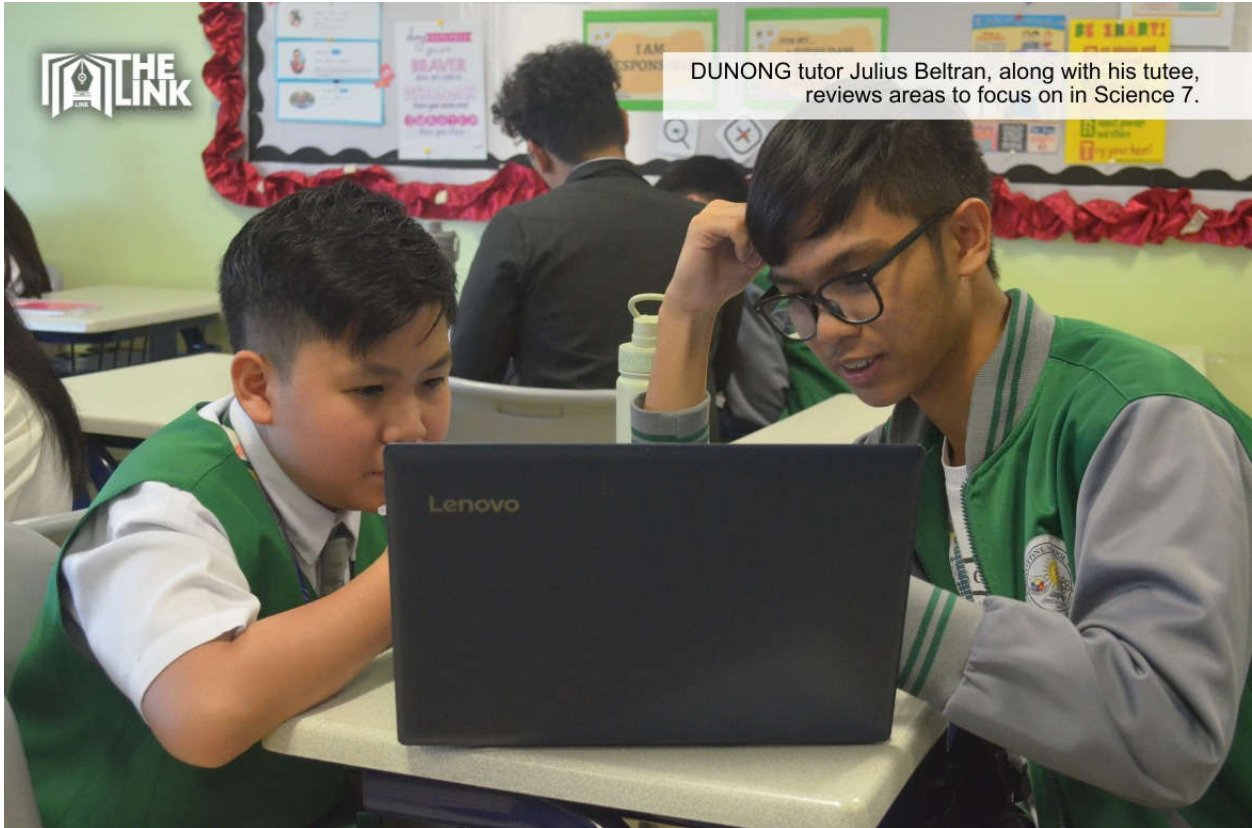


DUNONG tutor Angela Victorio helps a student go over her lessons in Mathematics 5.
