



JHS pushes student handbook revisit

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The Prefect of Discipline conducted a face-to-face meeting initiated by the Junior High School level leaders on July 31 at 10-Einstein's classroom to discuss both the minor and major offenses committed and the school policies.

Ms. Laarni Pascual, class adviser of 8-Darwin, was one of the proponents of the meeting. She mentioned the increasing number of sections as well as the new policies that teachers may not be aware of, making it significant for them to converse as a group. Furthermore, the standard procedure on how advisers should deal with minor and major offenses and their corresponding consequences was further expounded during the meeting.

“We will have a smooth flow in instilling discipline, not to punish the students but more to understand that students are capable of committing mistakes and making them realize how to correct their faults.”

Pascual emphasized that the meeting was conducted primarily to provide teachers with collective knowledge when instilling discipline in students.

Moreover, **Dr. Caridad A. Cañete**, Junior High School Vice Principal, highlighted that the reason the POD had an orientation with the teachers was to answer queries about policies that advisers should know as the first person students approach.

“We know that discipline is very important.”

said Dr. Cañete as she reiterated the significance of this meeting for teachers to properly disseminate school policies, governed by the student handbook, to help the POD in imbuing discipline among PSDians.
